Participating in this event was a great way to show unity, but also provided a way to connect with new friends, discover more about breast cancer, and to actively contribute to raising awareness.






Persuasive Essay: Let's Keep It Cool in School

Cinnamon Apple Waffles

Imagine - you wake up in the morning on a weekend, and it's really, *really* cold. You don't want to get out of bed and leave your cozy nest of blankets and pillows, so maybe you'll just sleep in until 11 am.... But wait. Cinnamon and sugar wafts into your room. Maybe getting up is a good idea after all. Try this delicious recipe to get your fall mornings off to a cozy start!

Ingredients for Waffles:

- 8 tablespoons (1 stick) unsalted butter
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons of packed light brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 2 large eggs
- 1 3/4 cups milk
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Ingredients for Cinnamon Apple Topping:

- 5 medium (about 7 cups) apples, peeled, thinly sliced
- ½ cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 3 tablespoons water
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 ½ teaspoons ground cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg

Waffle Directions:

- Cut 1 stick unsalted butter into 8 pieces and place in a small microwave-safe bowl. Microwave until melted, 30 to 45 seconds, or just melt it on the stove in a small pan/pot. Set aside to cool slightly while you prepare the batter.
- Place the flour, brown sugar, cinnamon, baking powder, and salt in a large bowl and whisk, breaking up any lumps of brown sugar.
- Place eggs, milk, and vanilla extract in a medium bowl and whisk to combine. While whisking constantly, slowly pour in the melted butter. Add the egg mixture to the flour mixture and stir just until well combined.
- 4. Heat the waffle iron according to the manufacturer instructions. Coat the surface of the waffle iron with cooking spray. Pour in the amount of batter recommended in the manufacturer instructions. Close the lid and cook until the waffle is golden-brown.

Cinnamon Apple Topping Directions:

1. Combine all cinnamon apples ingredients in a saucepan. Cook for 15-20 minutes over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until the apples are tender.

Finally, it's time to enjoy your waffles!
